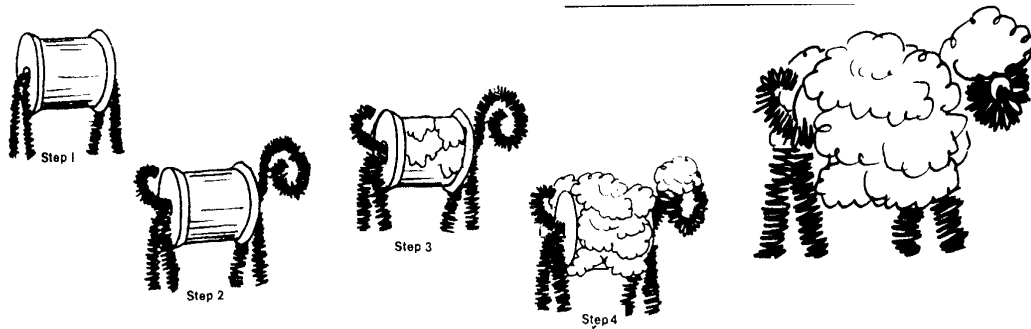


Sheep in Arizona

Francisco Vásquez de Coronado of Spain and Governor Juan de Oñate of New Mexico introduced sheep to Arizona in the 1500s. Sheep ranching started in Arizona in the 1880s and became big business in Flagstaff.



You Need:

- One empty thread spool per sheep
- Three black pipe cleaners
- Cotton balls
- Glue
- Plastic craft eyes (optional)

Wool is fleecy hair that covers sheep is used for blankets & clothing

Mutton is sheep meat that you eat

Ewes are female sheep

Lambs are young ewes and rams

Rams are male sheep

Step 1: Stick two pipe cleaners through the spool and bend them to make legs.

Step 2: Bend the third pipe cleaner as shown to make a head. Stick this pipe cleaner through the spool and bend the other end of it to make a tail.

Step 3: Cover the spool with glue.

Step 4: Apply cotton balls

Step 5: Put a drop of glue on the back of each eye and apply it to the sheep's face.
