

Travel Games



The Arizona Historical Society Museum at Papago Park in Tempe has a “stretch” automobile that is made up from parts of four old cars. These parts are from: 1920, 1935, 1956, and 1990. Can you tell which section is the black leather convertible from 1920? What about the truck from 1990?

Game 1:

Rule #1 All players need to find all the letters in the alphabet, in order, on road signs along the way.

Rule #2 When a person sees a letter, they say that letter out loud.

Rule #3 Only one letter can be used from each sign. Players cannot use the same sign.

Example: See a sign that says “gAs next exit” I say out loud, “A.”

Game 2:

Rule #1 One player picks an object that they see either out the window or in the car and then says, “Got it!” once they have picked their object.

Rule #2 The other players take turns asking yes or no questions.

Rule #3 Players have 20 questions to try to guess the object.

Game 3:

Rule #1 Players switch off making up silly sentences from the combined numbers and letters of license plates in any order using as many or as few letter and numbers

Rule #2 Using out-of-state license plates gives you another turn.

Example: 4MCT49

*This license plate could be: 4 mouse children talked 49 hours.
